In fact, Jay started his senior career at the age of fourteen. They are the very epitome of home-grown talent. Today they played their 100<sup>th</sup> game of senior footy for the Hawks, together. A fact of which all Hawks supporters should be proud.

Ben, the older of the two, has returned to the footy club this year after a couple of years away. His return has brought nothing but positives to the Hawks. Known as 'The Pig', for reasons best his Mum does not know, he is a big key position player these days. He spent today in the ruck and acquitted himself well. 




