We hope everyone is well.

We recently supported Kellerberrin Police with a response to an active armed shooter situation. While it was a tragic situation, and a very sad outcome for two families, we were proud to play a part in protecting the community from further harm. Our thoughts are with the families and friends of the two men involved as well as the Kellerberrin and surrounding communities.

There was a liquor related incident in July at the Narembeen Hotel where a person engaged in a lewd manner at the licensed premises. Wheatbelt Liquor Enforcement carried out an investigation and a caution was subsequently issued under the provisions of the Liquor Control Act.

We thank Wheatbelt Youth Policing who attended Narembeen DHS and gave a Graffiti Presentation last month. Unfortunately, we have had another incident of graffiti with a black marker pen in the men's public toilets at Jones Park on Churchill Street. If you have any information regarding this offence, please give us a call, we are eager to find the culprit.

R U OK? Day, our National Day of Action is on 14 September. We're calling on everyone to let the people they care about know they're here, to really hear them. Asking, 'are you OK?' is the first step, but we also need to genuinely listen to what comes next.

Please be advised Narembeen Police Station will be Temporarily Closed for approximately three weeks while undergoing maintenance and required works are carried out from Monday 18 September. Further information regarding the reopening will be forthcoming at a later date. We will be working out of Bruce Rock Police Station for the duration.

Next Thursday our PP – Year 10's will be involved in a presentation by the CEO of this amazing organisation Mr Greg Hibble. This has been organised through Kerry Fricker and the association this charity has with the members of our Autumn Club. Our Narembeen Autumn Club members knit blankets and a teddy which goes in the box with the wheelchair to be sent to children who need wheelchairs in war-ravaged countries, including Iraq, Libya and Syria. This organisation has the volunteers to manufacture and donate as many wheelchairs as is needed, it is only the materials that need buying. 

What Happened On This Day – September 13

• 1993 Oslo accords are signed

Also known as Declaration of Principles on Interim Self-Government Arrangements, the Accords helped create the Palestinian interim self-government or the Palestinian National Authority (PNA) and called for the withdrawal of the Israeli Defence Forces from the West Bank and Gaza Strip.

• 1974 French Ambassador is Kidnapped in the Hague

3 members of the Japanese Red Army (JRA), a communist militant group that was formed in Lebanon, stormed the French Embassy in the Hague and took 10 hostages, including the French Ambassador. The siege ended after the militants' demands for a release of another JRA member, cash, and a plane was met.

1933 A Woman is Elected to New Zealand Parliament for the first time

Elizabeth McCombs won the by-elections for the parliamentary seat of Lyttelton, which was held by her husband before he died in August 1933. New Zealand extended suffrage to women in 1893.

1899 First Recorded Automobile Fatality in the US takes place

Henry H. Bliss was struck by a taxi cab while crossing the street in New York City. He died the next day due to his injuries.

1759 The Battle of Quebec is fought between the British and the French

A key event in the Seven Years' War that involved the great European powers at the time, the battle took place on the farm of Abraham Martin. Because of this, the battle is also often called the Battle of the Plains of Abraham. British troops under the command of General James Wolfe defeated the French in the very short, 15-minute long battle and took over Quebec. The Battle resulted in the French giving up their control over areas in present-day Canada and most of North America coming under the control of the British
