

End of an era today at Narembeen Medical Centre.


Mrs Di Miolini was Peter's last appointment today, and she also saw him on his first day consulting in Narembeen in December 2000, nearly 23 years ago.

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN EDUCATION AWARDS 2023

Firstly we want our school community to know that we are not spending our time looking at nominating for these awards every year. We had been a finalist on two previous occassions prior to 2022 and we just knew that we were good enough to win the award. In 2022, we put together a great nomination, that we all had input into, and spent considerable time completing, and we were a finalist, **and then we won, and we really did deserve the recognition**. It was not our intention to nominate again, even though our NAPLAN was good enough to be once again recognised as one of the best in the state (as stated when we answered the Ministerial about what we do to continually get good results). However, on the penultimate day of the term, while I was at Country Week, our **Director of Schools, Wheatbelt, Mr Doug Cook** rang me to ask if he could nominate us in the awards. It was our decision to go with Leadership, as we won the Primary Award last year and going again may have been a bit over the top! SCIENCE UPDATE

The three students doing the Year 10 Chemistry can be very proud of the effort they have put into their work, they have been able to cope with the difficult work, much of it Year 11 curriculum content, and they are to be congratulated on their mature and diligent approach. Well done, Zack, Deakan and Cheyenne.

At the end of Term 3, the Year 7/8 class had their final test in Chemistry and top mark went to Year 7 student **Brady Poot**, who scored **92%**. Wren Cheetham also scored an A grade with **90%**, and a highly satisfactory score of **88%** was achieved by Jack Cusack.

INAUGURAL CORE WHEATBELT RESOURCE CHALLENGE

On Tuesday October 24 2023, the Year 5 students attended the Inaugural CoRE Wheatbelt Resource Challenge. This Resource Challenge provided students with an opportunity to learn about Western Australia's rich resources industry through practical activities. The day involved engineering an open pit and highway to transport the ore to the mill, while considering safety and sustainability through construction and rehabilitation. Volunteers from BHP and the University of Western Australia observed the groups during the action to identify students who demonstrated leadership, problem-solving, collaboration and inclusion skills.

The first section, 'The Open Pit,' included the construction of the Open Pit and the removal of all the ore bricks using the haulage system. Our team (Tampia Mafic Gneiss) was the first group to remove all the ore bricks and our winning points went towards our final ladder placing. After the first activity, we learned that the pack up of a site involves just as much organisation and teamwork as the set up. The final activity in the Core Challenge involved building a highway and using hammers and chisels to locate the gold. We needed 60 pieces of gold to complete the task, but unfortunately the desperate search for the 60th piece delayed our finish time. This was such a fun and engaging task that had all 10 students completing their role in the activity as efficiently and effectively as they could. Our team came in 4th place out of a total 9 teams. Congratulations to our 'Top Mine Worker' Charlie Cusack, who was recognised for his high standard of communication and problem-solving skills.




