Genset on Wheels

Upon the commencement of the mining by Ramelius Resources Ltd, the power supply to the Mt Arrowsmith Tennis Club was disconnected, leading to the non-utilisation of the facility during this period. The initial agreement between Ramelius and the Shire of Narembeen stipulated that the power would be restored. Instead of reconnecting the power to the Western Power infrastructure, the Council engaged in negotiations with Ramelius, resulting in the provision of a 30KVA trailermounted generator. This alternative offers flexibility by serving other facilities in the event of emergencies.

On behalf of the Council and the Narembeen community, I express gratitude to Ramelius Resources Ltd for accommodating this alternative solution. Additionally, I would like to acknowledge the ongoing and positive engagement with Hugh Trivell, Mine Manager, and Rachel Osborne, Site Administration.







Roe MOU - Roe Health

Council approved the extension of the current Memorandum of Understanding for the Roe Regional Organisation of Council (RoeROC) by an additional five years. RoeRoc established in October 2006, serves as a platform for facilitating voluntary cooperation and resource sharing between the Shires of Corrigin, Kondinin, Kulin, and Narembeen.

Successful collaboration allows for the ongoing joint management of the Bendering Landfill and the delivery of a dependable environmental health service.

Exciting News for Recipients

Council has accepted the recommendation from the Ramelius Resources and Shire of Narembeen Community Benefit Fund Advisory Committee to greenlight the following grant applications:

CEACA Membership

The Shire of Narembeen has recently become a member of the Central Accommodation and Care Alliance Inc (CEACA). Formed in 2012, CEACA's current membership includes the Shires of Bruce Rock, Kellerberrin, Merredin, Mt Marshall, Mukinbudin, Narembeen, Westonia, Wyalkatchem, and Yilgarn. CEACA's main purpose is to provide affordable and purpose -built accommodation for the elderly and those living with a disability, it also assists those who are on a very low income to secure affordable, easycare accommodation. The Alliance has secured and built 71 units across 11 shires in the Central East Wheatbelt Region.

CEACA is currently preparing submissions seeking commonwealth and state funding to enable the construction of additional accommodation units across the existing council members. If successful, Narembeen may see 3 or 4 units.

Cr Holly Cusack is a member of the CEACA Executive Committee and is the CEACA Treasurer.


You can be sure that come December 1 the CRC will be busy decorating their shopfront to be in the running for the Christmas light prize.


Do you have a CD player in your car? Would you like to listen to an audio book without losing signal? Come in to the Library and checkout the huge range. Membership to the


Christmas Printing







