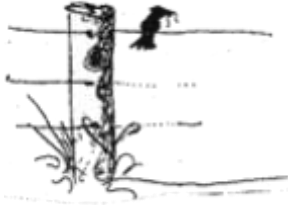

Our Subs manager; Wendy Keane and Eleanor Brayshaw. To our Distributors Patti Latham with her coffee buddy Marj Coverley. Thanks and good luck in life after The FencePost to our Money Lady- Yvonne Treloar. The mantle has been passed to Maurie Harper. Welcome Maurie the Money Man! Thanks so much to each and everyone of you!!

A special mention to Anita Cowan, she retired after last years AGM. Anita has been a stalwart at The Fencepost for many years. Working as a typist, an Editor and Editor in Chief. Our group of volunteers is what keeps us going. Quite simply, without you lot we wouldn't have a local paper at all. The hours you put in to make a paper for our community is wonderful.

We should all be extremely proud that we still publish a weekly paper for 45 weeks of the year!

Annual Report to the AGM 2020

We have been in the new office for over a year now and I'd say we have settled in well. Thanks must go to the trusty CRC. Thankyou to Vanessa Wittstock(the Manager) and her great staff: Kristie Lee, Julie Miller and Georgia Atkins for their ongoing help and support.

The CRC works under the Shire and we enjoy their full backing also.

To our distributors in the Narembeen Roadhouse, IGA, the Post Office and the Medical Centre; we appreciate their willingness to have our FencePost on their premises and to IGA for taking it out on the mail run.

This year the amount of FencePosts being printed has been reduced by only five, to 140 per week. Email copies have nearly doubled from 20 last year to 38 this year. There are 54 copies being mailed whereas last year there were 31.

Advertising is down \$1570 from just last year! Last year it was reduced by \$1700. Previously we were seeing reductions like \$300/year. It will be interesting to see if this trend continues. This year is out of the box, with the pandemic skewing the figures.

Looking at what we charge for customers to advertise in The FencePost, it is not high; surrounding districts are quite often considerably higher.

As has been the case historically, most local businesses do not use The Fencepost to advertise. This is not unusual, most businesses just don't advertise anywhere.

Lastly, to keep things in perspective: the total cost of one FencePost this year is \$2.64. (Last year it was \$2.40.) We are selling each one for \$1.50 and we print 6300 copies.

This means we are effectively donating over \$7000 to the community.

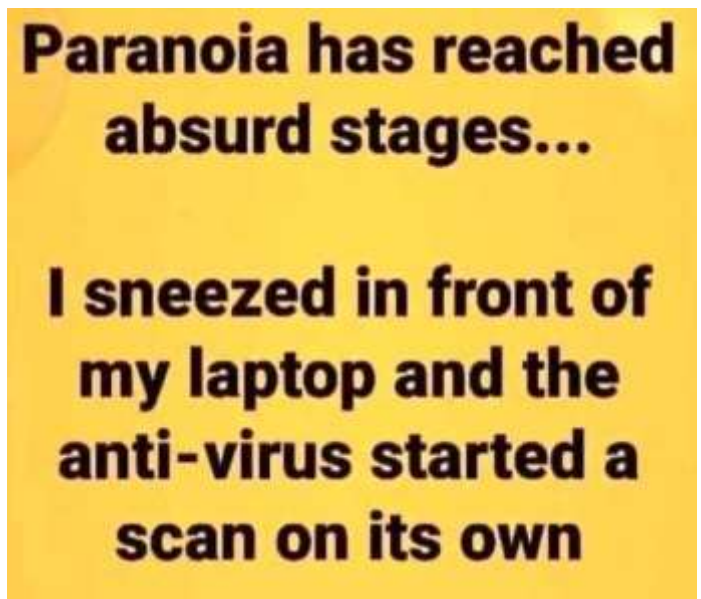

BRADBURY'S STORE & FARM

As recently advertised in the 'Fencepost,' the Historical Society requested help in finding the location of the above farm. I am pleased to say we were successful.

After much research through Landgate and family records, the granddaughter of Hubert and Phyllis Bradbury; Sue Hoffman, was able to provide information which set things in motion.

Thanks to one of the early rate books (1926 – 27) we eventually found the relevant number and correlated it with the one which Sue had received.

Over the years the farm has been owned by Thomas Garnaut, Hubert Bradbury, Richard Stanley Sampson and William Clement Escott. In more recent times the farm belonged to Metcalfs and is now farmed by Craig Kennedy.

Feeling confident that we were on the right track Sue, husband David, Craig and I set out for the farm last Wednesday. We visited three blocks and determined that the second one was the one in question. As a child, Sue had visited with her family and there were enough landmarks verbally recorded by her mother to give the findings authenticity. The usual photos were taken to add to the family memoirs and it was a joy to see how much pleasure the experience engendered.

Leaving Craig to drive his tractor back to town from the farm we proceeded to the Mt Walker School (site) to which Sue's aunt Elsie and her mother Jean rode a horse each day from the farm.

Back at the History Centre after lunch we doublechecked a few facts, and found the Bradbury girls' names listed among the first students at the Mt Walker School in 1927. Sue passed on some copies of photos of her grandparents, aunt and mother and she was delighted to receive a copy of Iris Bristow's 'Seedtime and Harvest.'

There was a group photo of the children including Elsie, at the Narembeen School in 1923. This was situated at the present Community Shed site. Elsie attended that school when her father had the store in town prior to taking up the farm. We now have several photos and other notes to create a Bradbury file for our archives.

In the main street we arrived just in time for coffee at The Co-op. Thank you Jess for accommodating us at the last minute. Sue was able to sit in the premises in which her grandfather operated his store. The family lived at the rear of the shop.

While in Narembeen Sue was able to reconnect with Noela Cole, with whom she worked in Perth over thirty years ago – another bonus.

The Hoffmans were full of praise for the town and the hospitality shown. They spent three nights here and are looking forward to returning for any special events e.g. the proposed Centenary celebrations of local government in 2024. A generous donation was given by Sue to the Historical Society for which we are grateful.

Thank you to all who assisted in any way towards the success of this project. Rachel, Sharon and Scott at the Shire for their help with maps etc, members of the public for suggestions as to the location, and in particular Craig Kennedy for giving up his day to accompany us to the farm. We could not have done it without you.

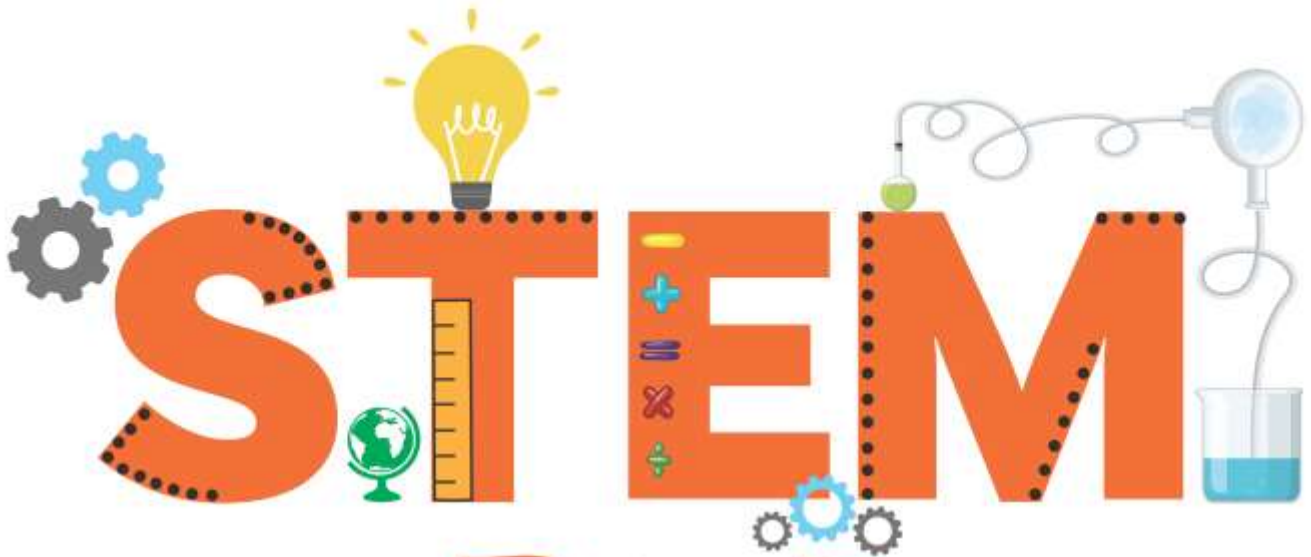

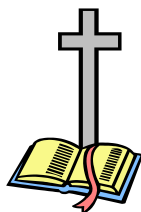
