





**Jordan Spriggs Sculpture in the Bush tour kicked off in Narembeen on 30<sup>th</sup> June 2022.**

Jordan delighted all who attended with the inspirational story of his early years and his love of tinkering in the shed, the enjoyment and guidance he received from all the teachers at Narembeen DHS and the support and encouragement he received from his community. Many of his teachers are still at the school developing young minds and hearts to prosper in a changing world. He spoke fondly of his design and metal work classes with Mr Arnold and the encouragement he received from growing up in a small farming community.

His take-home message was to never ‘give up’ on your aspirations, to keep trying, and with practice and enjoyment, amazing things will happen, as he can attest too. Jordan shared how he fell into becoming a sculptor and his journey from making and selling his first sculpture; a prehistoric bird when he was 15 years old at Wesley College (now living in the Narembeen Hardware Store), to creating the beautiful African Oryx he will be showcasing on tour over the next few months around WA and selling his works both home and abroad.



Jordan attributes his success to having a go, growing up in a small supportive community, easily accessible materials, his desire, and commitment to making animals only, the saleability of his art (demand) and the targeted use of social media.

He currently has 2 million followers over 3 platforms, Facebook, Instagram and more recently Tick Tok making up his largest following. He said there is currently only a small percentage of followers that have actually seen any of his pieces in person. He believes there is so much more to his sculptures up close and personal to see the details, touch, and interact with the moving parts.

Some of the signature elements in all his work include the use of stainless steel for the eyes and parts such as the antlers on the Oryx to make the piece pop! He often also has small birds sitting somewhere on the larger animal pieces and his initials inscribed on a piece of metal embedded somewhere on the body.

It was inspirational to hear him speak about his work, how he grew into becoming a well-renowned Sculptor and the support living in a small country town contributed to his success, he said everyone sharing his posts and being proud of him made him known widely quickly, and believes that would not have been possible if he was located in Perth.....Diana Blacklock





Letter to the Fencepost editor re Avoca Farm

### **An invitation for expressions of support to Save Avoca Farm homestead and shearing shed**

The Avoca farm homestead and shearing shed have fallen into disrepair. The historic mudbrick homestead building requires urgent repairs to address developing safety issues. Several concerned Narembeen residents have approached councillor Chris Bray regarding formation of an action or working group to formulate a plan to save the buildings from further deterioration.


The buildings represent significant historic and cultural value to the community and the wheatbelt region of WA. It seems counter intuitive to include the farm as a destination for the now complete walk and cycle trail yet disregard the cultural value of the buildings as a community asset.

There are no plans outlined in the current Shire of Narembeen Strategic Community Plan to budget for repairs to the buildings. However, there may be a limited window of opportunity for residents to express interest in saving the buildings and request Council investigate funding opportunities.

A number of community members have expressed interest in assisting with initiating a project to save the homestead and shearing shed if there is sufficient community support and expressions of interest in joining an action or working group.




