G'day folks,

Thefts – Dorcas had some property stolen overnight Friday 29th July. Police would like to identify this individual walking past Dorcas near midnight carrying a torch, they may be able to assist with our enquiries.



The Post Office was broken into overnight Friday 5th August. Our investigations remain ongoing for both so if you know or have your suspicions please contact us or Crime Stoppers.

On two separate matters, two adult males have been recently charged for unrelated thefts. One accessed an unlocked vehicle and subsequently frauded bank funds, whilst the other stole items from an unattended property, both having to explain their actions to the magistrate.

We currently have some new Neighbourhood Rural Watch fence signs at the police station. Property owners can stop in and collect them, or give us a call and we will pop them on your fence in high visible areas when out your way on our patrols.



Check out neighbourhood watch / crime prevention / rural for tips to keep your property secure.

Illicit Drugs - Where there is theft unfortunately drugs aren't too far away. The community tolerates a bit before generally coming together to weed out those causing the negative affect. If you cannot come to us directly I encourage you to call Crime Stoppers, either way lets work together on bringing those with no respect for others property to justice.

Should you or someone you know have a substance dependency and not sure who or what to reach out for help, the Narembeen CRC and Holyoake have some excellent support services to anyone seeking assistance. You are not alone and help is available, all you need to do is ask. Police can also offer support services and advise so long as you're not stealing from others!

Drink & Drug Drivers - Police efforts will increase RBT's and RDT's **Random Drug Tests**. If you've never done one chances are maybe that will change soon. The image of a positive RDT a couple of weeks ago in Narembeen has landed the driver an impending court date. With all the community messaging its disheartening that drink and drug driving remains a major focus and consumes so much of our time.



Get a skipper, limit your alcohol intake, walk or take a courtesy vehicle whichever helps you make the right choice we encourage, but make the wrong choice just remember it was your choice.

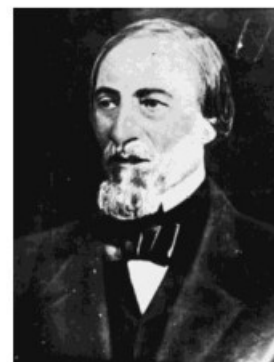
AUGUST HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS

RANGER REPORTS - CATS

There have been several complaints and reports about wandering cats recently.

Responsible and legal cat ownership requires all cats over six months to be sterilized, microchipped, and registered with the Shire of Narembeen. Sterilization is the most important thing you can do for these animals as this will protect native animal and ensure the problem does get worse. Letting stray cats breed and then contacting the Ranger Services to remove kittens is simply not sustainable.

Arrangements can be made with the Merredin Vet to sterilize cats and discounts are offered for those people who qualify financially.

Under the Cat Act it is also an offence to give away kittens. The reason for this law is to ensure responsibility on the part of the owner as often a family receives a kitten, doesn't get it desexed as "it costs too much money" then lose interest in the kitten as it gets older. This can result the in the kitten becoming a feral animal.

For those of you having issues with feral cats, Shire of Narembeen owns a number of traps which are available for use.

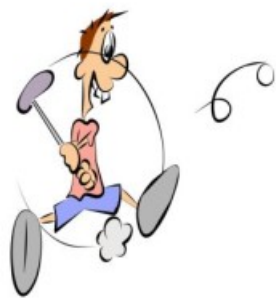

2002....

One of the things footy does that is dumb is that we only remember who finishes first. We laud the premierships winners and forget those that didn't win it. Our measure of success is all out of whack. American sports do it better where they tell the stories of teams that have succeeded rather than just those that won, there is a difference. That's a great shame for we miss out on the stories of some really great teams. Teams like the Narembeen Footy Club's league side of 2002.

2002 was a year when Narembeen was a club in trouble. They only played two Ressies games through the year and had found no recruits to bring into the group. In the end they were a club, or indeed just a side, that was made up of Narembeen people. They were all locals and a couple of ex-locals who were travelling up for nothing just to help out. The remarkable thing about this story is that despite this situation, they finished second. A remarkable effort.

At the front of this effort was Grant Mills. Mills was in his second, and final, year as player coach at the footy club and was a leader that clearly had his group, both on and off the field. Mills was the talisman of the whole club. He ran training that engaged players and was a wonderful player himself. His ability to play as a prime mover on the ground and then give the most controlled and considered addresses at all the breaks was something to behold. He rarely raised his voice through the year and empowered all his players to such a point that they would often do things you just didn't see in them.

Then there were his off-siders through the middle. Nick Cheetham and Mike Currie were both in their mid-twenties in 2002 and probably in their prime. Along with Mills they formed a midfield that had not only some genuine pace but also a level of ball use that meant the ball stayed in their hands for a long time. Wayne Hooper and the late great Steve Currie were also supreme ball users in this side with both going between half-back and the middle. I've probably forgotten someone but that was pretty much it. There was little to no depth, there boys had to do lead the way.

The 2002 was a side that asked a lot of everyone and that included asking a lot of a young Ben Hunter, Clint Butler and Brendan Parsons. From memory a young Parsons played at full-back, or at least key-back in this side and gave early signs of what would be a wonderful career at the club. He took on big forwards well and would often belie his age with his ball use. A young Hunter on a wing just got better and better in his second year of senior footy and fifteen-year-old Clint Butler was a dangerous forward. I've no doubt missed some out but the fact is while numbers were short quality was high.

They finished third and found themselves up at the Cross against the reigning premier in the Qualifying Final. They got beaten easily and had to reset themselves for a First Semi against the Rock. It was a high-scoring affair against a good Rock side which included names such as Fullgrabe, Heasman, Griffiths and Bow. They won by nine points. This would take them into a preliminary final against Southern Cross at the Rock.

I remember watching this game. The Cross started well, they may have even been three or four goals up at one stage if memory serves. Then the Hawks not only ran them down but ran away with it. Mike Currie and Grant Mills were named in the best while Sheldon Miller kicked four goals. Against a very good reigning premier side which included the talented Nathan Mourish this was a win that should be remembered.

They would go on to play a Grand Final at home against a Hyden/Kalgarin side that was looking to win their first ever league flag. They stayed with the Saints for a long time but got run over towards the end. While they would come second it was a season that deserves its story told. A club that was struggling for numbers just to field a side found a way to win and keep winning. They not only made the finals but won their way to a Grand Final they really had no right to win. It was a season of positivity, resilience and effort and it was one that the Hawks and all Hawks supporters should always remember.

Trust.....

Football sides take steps in their evolution. The pace with which they move through these steps is not uniform, but the order normally is. Firstly, they learn how to become hard to play. Then they learn how to defend. Then they learn how to move the ball fast. Learn how to score and learn how to win. Often, perhaps too often, they learn how to trust.

Trust is a vital part of any team sport but especially in footy. The off shoot of this trust is that when you know you are being trusted by someone else, you have players working harder to prove that trust is well founded. They don't want to let each other down. This Narembeen Hawks side still have this lesson to learn.

In slippery conditions last Saturday the Hawks had it all to play for. Win and they would finish on top and gain a home final. In their way was one of the club's oldest adversaries, Kulin/Kondinin. It was always going to be a tough contest and inside the contest it was, all day. However outside of that fight for the ball the Blues beat the Hawks and beat them well. Why? Simply because the Hawks didn't trust each other.

What happens when a team trusts themselves and their teammates is they get numbers to the contest and in the right place. Players play their role, do their job and trust their teammates to do theirs. As the pressure rose on Saturday too many Hawks tried to do too much and got opened up as a result. Often they would win the ball in the middle of the ground and go forward to a half forward line full of blue jumpers. Their half forwards had come too far up the ground and were unable to give their midfield the option up the ground. This made it hard to score.

In the middle of the ground the Hawks would often have too many at the coalface, trying to win the footy. They didn't show the trust in their teammates already there and as a result when it wasn't won there was no defence to shut it down. Even when they did stand off the contest the midfield didn't work back to man up the next Blues player to get the ball as they should have. They split that space in a sign they didn't have faith in what was going on around the ball. It was a matter of trust.

All is not lost though; this is a side of talented young men of good character. They can come again and be better for the challenge. This week finals start and they get another crack at the Blues. They are more than capable of winning the day, they just have to trust each other.

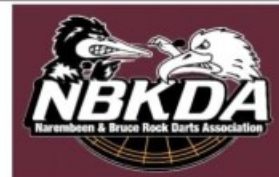
