Melting Moments*

375gr (3/4lb) Plain Flour
125gr (1/4lb) Custard Powder
125gr (1/4lb) Icing Sugar
375gr (3/4lb) Butter

Cream together the butter and sugar and add the flour and custard powder previously well sifted together. Make into small balls about the size of a walnut, place on cold oven slide and press with a flour-pronged fork. Bake a pale brown in a moderate oven.

Put two together with butter icing flavoured with vanilla. Roll in icing sugar. Allow the biscuits to become cold before joining together.

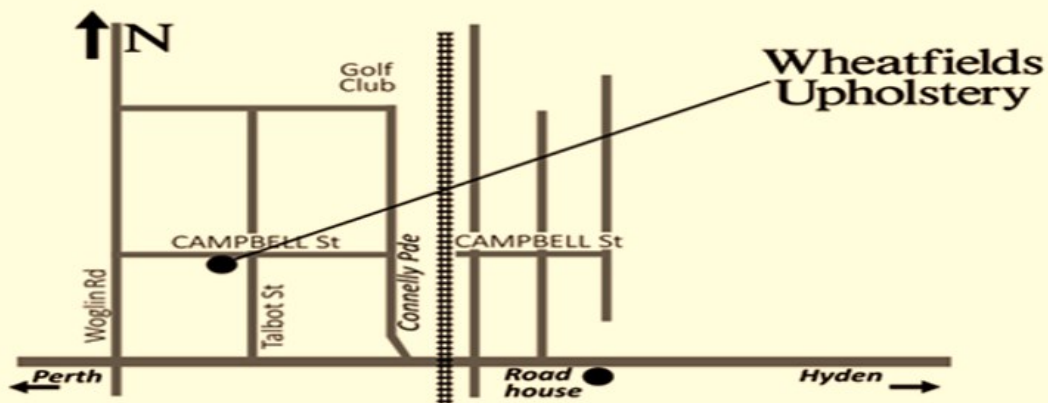

Hello,

Hope everyone is well.

On 11 May, Narembeen and Bruce Rock Police charged a 43-year-old male person of no fixed place of abode with Burglary and Stealing as the result of inquiries into an incident in East Bunbury on the 20 April, 2023. The offender was also found in possession of unlicensed ammunition and had an outstanding Arrest Warrant. His bail was refused and he appeared at Perth Magistrates Court on 12 May. A very long day but KFC was a highlight.

Every year, around 1,200 people are killed and another 44,000 seriously injured on Australian roads. Traffic injuries are the biggest killer of Australian children under 15 and the second-biggest killer of those aged 15 – 24 years.

These numbers are growing but are also preventable if road users Drive So Others Survive!

We are proud to back this initiative to reduce road trauma by working together to promote and enforce road safety,

As at 9 May, 54 people have lost their lives on Western Australian roads this year which is an increase on 2022. So, please Drive Safely.

Don't forget, Walk Safely to School Day is taking place on Friday, May 19 as part of National Road Safety Week. We will be out in support of it.

**ROEROC BENDERING LANDFILL AREA
COMMUNITY CROPPING OPPORTUNITY**

ROEROC is again looking towards local Community Groups in the ROEROC Region of Shires of Corrigin, Kondinin, Kulin and Narembeen, for the opportunity of a Community Cropping Program on the unused portion of the Bending Landfill Site.

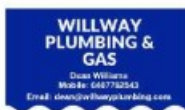

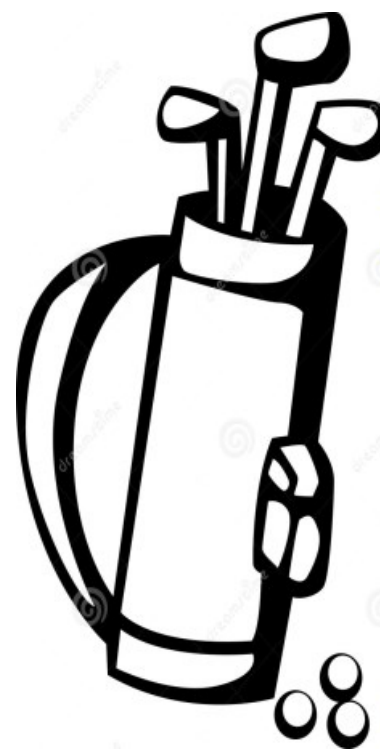
